Government Funding Explained



From April 2024, nurseries are required to clearly outline the difference between government-funded sessions and any additional charges. At Alphabet House, we are committed to providing outstanding care and early education for your child. The government funding is designed to cover the cost of basic care, ensuring all children have access to quality early years education.

To enhance your child's experience, we offer additional services and resources that go beyond the basic provision, such as extra activities, specialist sessions, and meal options. These are optional, and you can choose to opt out if you prefer. Our goal is to provide flexible, high-quality care that works for your family.

What government funding covers

Government funding is designed to support families by covering the basic costs of early years education. At Alphabet House, this means your child will receive high-quality care in a safe, stimulating environment that encourages learning and development.

Funded hours include:

- A place in our nursery during agreed funded session times
- · A safe and nurturing learning environment
- Access to age-appropriate educational activities that follow the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) framework
- A staffing level that meets the minimum government ratios

While funding covers these essential aspects of the EYFS, it does not include extras such as meals, specialist activities, or enhanced services. These enhancements are available separately to enrich your child's nursery experience.



What's outside of the scope of government funding

We believe in providing every child with the highest standard of care, learning, and development. To achieve this, we offer a range of enhancements that go beyond the funded provision, ensuring that your child receives the best possible early years experience.

These enhancements include:

- Nutritious meals and snacks carefully planned to support your child's growth and development throughout the day
- Specialist sessions engaging activities such as music, movement, cooking, and language classes that enrich your child's • learning through play and creativity
- Premium resources high-quality learning materials, waterproof clothing for outdoor play, and specialist equipment to enhance your child's learning experience
- Trips and outings enriching experiences that take learning beyond the nursery setting

- Nursery in a Box our comprehensive system for tracking your child's development, keeping you updated on their daily experiences, learning progress (in line with the EYFS framework), meals, sleep, and nappies
- Parties and celebrations special events to celebrate birthdays, cultural festivities, and seasonal occasions, making nursery life even more exciting
- Parental support guidance and resources to help families navigate early childhood development, from sleep routines to learning milestones
- Outdoor learning & Forest Schools held in our own dedicated forest space and allotment, allowing children to explore nature, develop problemsolving skills, and build confidence in an inspiring outdoor setting

These elements are a fundamental part of the exceptional care we provide, ensuring that every child receives the attention, support, and experiences they deserve.

However, in line with government guidelines, parents do have the option to decline certain additional services. If you have any questions, we are always happy to discuss how we can best support your family's needs.

What are my options?

At Alphabet House, we want to offer flexibility while ensuring your child receives the best possible care. You have two options available:

Enhanced Care (Current Service)

This is the service your child is currently receiving. With this option, your child benefits from high-quality early years education, enriched with additional activities both indoors and outdoors, nutritious meals, specialist sessions, and premium resources. These enriching experiences are designed to support your child's development in every area. To continue providing this level of care, we ask for and we will be happy to discuss how we can your contribution to cover the cost of consumables such as meals, nappies, and resources that are part of the enhanced care experience.

Opt Out of Enhanced Care

If you decide to opt out, your child will still receive the government-funded hours of education, but without access to the enhanced care features such as meals, enriching activities, and premium resources. You will need to provide all consumables, including meals, nappies, and extra clothes. The funded hours will be scheduled according to our availability, best meet your child's needs within this arrangement.



How we allocate your funding

We want to ensure that you can make the most of the government funding available to support your child's education and development. Depending on the funding option your child qualifies for, the allocation of hours can vary. Below, we've outlined how the 15 and 30-hour funding is distributed and how we structure it to best meet your child's needs throughout the year.

15 Hours Funding

If your child qualifies for the 15 hours of government funding, you'll be able to use 15 hours per week during term time, covering 38 weeks of the year. This gives your child the opportunity to receive high-quality care and education throughout the academic terms.

30 Hours Funding

For those eligible for the 30-hour funding, we distribute it across 51 weeks, which works out to exactly 22.35 hours per week. To maximize the benefits of this funding, we offer additional sessions that complement the funded hours, ensuring your child experiences a well-rounded and enriching education all year long.

Non-Funded Hours

In addition to the government funding, we understand that every family has unique needs when it comes to childcare schedules. To support this, we offer a variety of non-funded sessions that can be tailored to fit your family's schedule. These sessions are designed to complement the funded hours and ensure your child receives consistent care, regardless of their funding entitlement.

For specific pricing and availability of non-funded sessions, please feel free to contact our Nursery Manager, who will be happy to discuss the options that work best for you and your child.

Applying for Funding

Applying for government-funded childcare can seem complex, but we're here to make the process as straightforward as possible. Below, we've outlined the steps to help you navigate the application, ensuring your child receives the support they're entitled to.

When to apply

The timing of when your child can access the 15 or 30 hours of government funding is based on their birthdate, so it's essential to plan ahead. For those eligible for Working Family Funding, you will need to apply online and obtain an eligibility code to ensure your child can benefit from the funding

Important reminder

Be sure to log into your HMRC childcare account every three months to confirm your eligibility for Working Family Funding. If you miss this step, you could lose your funding for the upcoming term, which means you'll be responsible for covering any additional hours beyond the basic 15 hours scheme at our standard rate.

How to Apply

Universal funded childcare for 3 and 4 year Old

For 3 and 4-year-olds, simply reach out to your nearest Alphabet House nursery. Our friendly team will guide you through the process and ask for your child's birth certificate or passport as proof of eligibility—it's that easy!

For eligible 2-year-olds receiving government support

All you'll need is written confirmation from your local authority first. Once you have it, just provide it to our nursery manager, and if eligible, your funding will begin the term after your child turns 2 years old.

Working family funded childcare

Applying for working family-funded childcare might seem a bit daunting, but don't worry! By following the six simple steps below, you'll find the process straightforward and hassle-free.

Additinal Notes

- Separated Parents: If you and your partner are separated, you'll need to decide between you who will apply for the funding. If only one of you has parental responsibility, that person will need to apply.
- Reconfirmation Reminders: For working family-funded childcare, HMRC typically sends reminders when it's time to reconfirm your eligibility. However, it's always a good idea to set up your own reminder to ensure you don't miss out on this valuable support towards childcare costs.

FAQ's

Do I have to opt in for Enhanced Care?

No, opting in is your choice — but Enhanced Care gives your child access to all the extras we believe make a big difference: enrichment sessions, nappies, meals, and more. If you choose not to opt in, we'll discuss how to schedule your child's funded hours around our availability, and you'll need to provide all consumables and essentials yourself.

What does Enhanced Care include?

Enhanced Care covers things like enrichment activities (STEM, yoga, cooking), extra resources, nappies, meals, and even events and outings. It's designed to give your child the very best early years experience — and save you time and stress at home.

Can I change my mind after opting in or out?

Yes! We understand that circumstances change. Just speak with the Nursery Manager and we'll be happy to talk you through your options.

When should I apply for funded childcare?

Funding depends on your child's birthday, so it's important to apply ahead of time. You'll also need to apply for a code through HMRC if you're using the working family funding scheme.

How many funded hours will my child receive?

If you're eligible for 15 hours, they'll be spread across term time only. If you're receiving 30 hours, we'll stretch that funding over 51 weeks, which works out to just over 22 hours per week.

What if I need more hours than my funding covers?

No problem! We offer a variety of sessions to suit all kinds of schedules. Just chat with our Nursery Manager for a tailored plan and prices.
